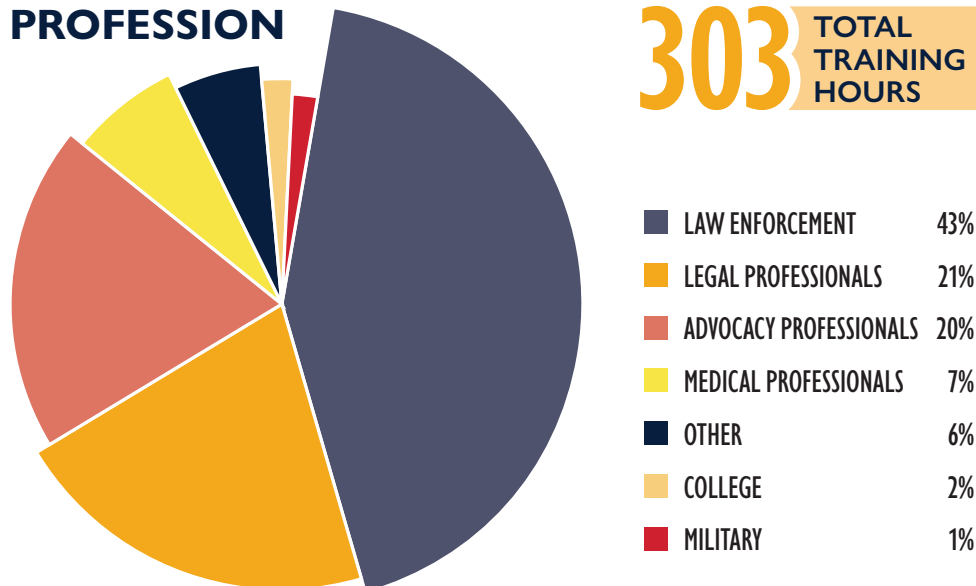

### TRAINING ATTENDEES BY PROFESSION



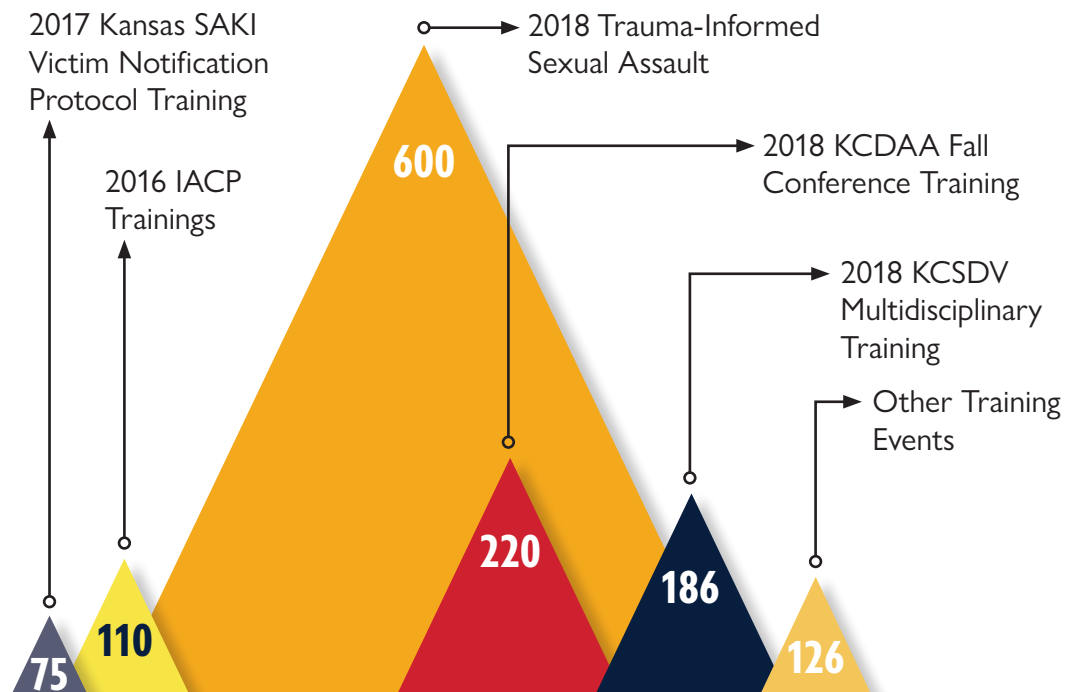
